

**TOWN OF WEST POINT  
CONTINUED MEETING  
OCTOBER 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2013  
Minutes**

**I Call to Order**

The Honorable James H. Hudson, III reconvened the Town Council meeting of September 26<sup>th</sup> 2013 on Wednesday, October 2<sup>nd</sup> 2013 at 7:00 P.M. at 180 Horse Landing Road, King William, Virginia 23086.

Members Present: Mayor, Jim Hudson; Tina Gulley; Wayne Healy, Bub Shreaves; Paul Kelley and Chris Vincent.

Members Absent: Deborah Ball and Jack Lawson.

Also Present: John Edwards, Town Manager; Andrea Erard, Town Attorney and Karen Barrow, Town Clerk.

**II. Discussion of Proposed Legislation**

Andrea Erard, Town Attorney referred to the Consent Order from Judge Hoover then presented Town Council and the King William Board of Supervisors with changes to the draft legislation proposed by King William at the September 26<sup>th</sup> 2013 joint meeting.

Danny Stack advised that he has reviewed the proposed legislation changes by the Town of West Point and stated that changes can be made and he would need to work on the language.

Andrea Erard reviewed the suggested changes.

A lengthy discussion ensued regarding the legislation, models, credits and split levy tax.

Terry Stone stated that she can accept the split levy and that she has not agreed on the credits for services. Ms. Stone also stated that she felt the mediation would not give West Point anything else other than the legislation. The Consent Order was rushed and she did not agree with it.

Bub Shreaves stated that the split levy has been in place for 100 years.

Steven Greenwood stated that it was not a legal form of taxation.

Mr. Edwards, Town Manager stated that changes to the West Point model were done based on the suggestions submitted by King William in the sub-committee meetings.

**III. Discussion of Proposed Town Model & Credits**

Trenton Funkhouser, County Administrator reviewed a power point presentation reflecting changes to the Town Model with credits.

Mr. Edwards stated that the credits have been removed and funds to cover abatements have been put in its place.

Jim Hudson, Mayor stated that at this point we are unable to agree to the legislation and what is fair and equitable. We need to proceed to mediation.

It was agreed upon by all present that the Town Attorney and County Attorney contact the mediators to proceed with mediation.

**IV. Adjournment**

There being no further business, Mayor Hudson adjourned the meeting at 8:25 P.M.
